systems approach e.g. respiratory, nervous system, etc. to help increase retention of key concepts and encourage application of pharmacological therapy in the context of disease management. It is recommended that you seek additional practice questions from resources that challenge you to go into pharmacological concepts such as serious adverse events and drug-to-drug interactions in detail and test your knowledge of specific nursing interventions related to drug therapy.
